As for wildlife, it's a playground for ospreys, shags, shearwaters, geckos, and turtles. Underwater, seagrass, gorgonians, sunfish, and

barracudas inhabit the seabed. Aboard your catamaran, you'll experience the rare luxury of silence, flamboyant sunsets, secret ports of call, and the simple pleasures of stopping in coastal villages. VOTRE CROISIÈRE JOUR APRÈS JOUR

DAY 1

Palma (La Lonja) – Cap Enderrocat

Meet in the late afternoon at La Lonja harbour, in the heart of Palma's historic centre. Dominated by its magnificent Gothic cathedral, the capital of Mallorca combines Mediterranean elegance with lively streets and sun-drenched cafés.

After meeting the crew and settling into your cabin, your catamaran gently leaves the harbour and sails towards Cap Enderrocat. This rugged coastline, lined with limestone cliffs and former military fortifications, offers a first glimpse of southern Mallorca's unspoilt character. Sunset welcome cocktail, dinner on board and overnight at anchor.

DAY 2

Cap Enderrocat – Cala Pi – Es Carbó – Cala Mondragó

The day begins with a short sail to Cala Pi. Deeply carved into the coastline, this spectacular inlet resembles a Mediterranean fjord. At the end of the narrow valley, framed by golden limestone cliffs, lies a beautiful sandy beach—perfect for a swim or a stroll ashore.

Your cruise then continues to Es Carbó. Less famous than neighbouring Es Trenc, this long, untouched beach charms visitors with its white sand, crystal-clear waters and remarkably preserved natural surroundings. Lunch is served at anchor overlooking this beautiful, largely undeveloped coastline.

In the late afternoon, you arrive at Cala Mondragó, nestled within a protected natural park where pine forests, limestone cliffs and secluded sandy coves create a stunning landscape.

Dinner and overnight at anchor.

DAY 3

Cala Mondragó – Cala d’Or – Crossing to Menorca

The morning is dedicated to discovering Cala d’Or. With its whitewashed houses inspired by Ibiza’s architecture, elegant marina and lively boutiques, this charming seaside resort offers a relaxed Mediterranean atmosphere. Enjoy some free time ashore before returning to your catamaran.

After lunch and a leisurely afternoon of swimming and relaxation, the crew sets sail in the evening for the crossing to Menorca.

As the catamaran heads towards the most unspoilt of the Balearic Islands, enjoy dinner on board before spending the night gently rocked by the sea.

DAY 4

Playa de Binigaus – Menorca’s Southern Coves – Cala Son Saura

Early in the morning, your catamaran reaches the southern coast of Menorca.

After a few hours of rest facing the long, wild beaches of Binigaus and Santo Tomás, the day is devoted to exploring Menorca’s famous southern coves.

Although these idyllic beaches attract thousands of visitors every summer, discovering them from the sea is by far the most enjoyable experience. While most holidaymakers are limited to a handful of beaches accessible by road, your catamaran slowly cruises along the island’s entire unspoilt coastline.

Cala Mitjana, Cala Mitjaneta, Cala Trebalúger, Cala Macarella and Cala Turqueta reveal themselves one after another. From the deck, the sea displays an extraordinary palette of colours, ranging from deep sapphire blue to brilliant turquoise. Between refreshing swims, you enjoy the sea breeze, far from the crowded beaches and the heat of the coastal trails. A truly privileged way to experience one of the Mediterranean’s most beautiful coastlines.

DAY 5

Cala Son Saura – Ciutadella

The morning is yours to enjoy at your own pace. Swimming, snorkelling, paddleboarding or simply relaxing... everyone can make the most of the crystal-clear waters of Cala Son Saura before lunch. In the early afternoon, enjoy a short sail to Ciutadella. The former capital of Menorca immediately captivates visitors with its natural harbour carved into the rock, elegant palaces, cobbled streets and lively cafés. Spend the afternoon exploring the town, shopping or enjoying an ice cream while wandering through its historic centre. Dinner on board and overnight at anchor off Ciutadella.

DAY 6

Ciutadella – Crossing to Mallorca – Cala Magraner – Cala Serena

An early departure marks the beginning of the return crossing to Mallorca. Breakfast is served while sailing as your catamaran heads southwest across the Balearic Sea. With a little luck, dolphins may come to accompany the boat along the way. Around lunchtime, you arrive at Cala Magraner. Sheltered beneath towering limestone cliffs, this wild cove offers a striking contrast between ochre-coloured rock, fragrant pine trees and turquoise waters. Later in the afternoon, enjoy a short sail to Cala Serena. This peaceful little cove provides the perfect final anchorage on Mallorca's eastern coast. Dinner and overnight at anchor.

DAY 7

Cala Serena – Es Trenc – Palma

Your final day begins with a sail towards Es Trenc, one of Mallorca's most iconic beaches.

Its long stretch of white sand, shallow turquoise waters and protected natural surroundings have earned it comparisons with some of the world's finest tropical beaches. Lunch is served at anchor in this exceptional setting. In the afternoon, depending on weather conditions and local traffic, your captain will select one final swimming stop in one of the beautiful coves along Mallorca's southern coast. A last opportunity to enjoy the crystal-clear waters before sailing back towards Palma. By the end of the day, your catamaran anchors opposite Palma's spectacular cathedral. Beautifully illuminated after sunset, it provides a memorable setting for your final evening on board.

Dinner and overnight at anchor beneath the cathedral.

DAY 8

Palma (La Lonja)

After a short sail back to La Lonja harbour, disembarkation takes place around 9:00 a.m.

It is time to say goodbye to your catamaran after an unforgettable week exploring the finest coastlines of Mallorca and Menorca, discovering secluded coves, charming Mediterranean towns and exceptional anchorages.
